WHY ENGINEERING AT BIRMINGHAM



ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Students must have passed year 1 in the relevant UCSI programme listed in the table above and must have achieved an overall score of at least 70% with all science modules taken and passed.

English Language

Students will also need to meet one of the following admission requirements for English language:

- Malaysian SPM 1119 Grade C
- IELTS 6.0 overall with no less than 5.5 in any band
- TOEFL 80 overall with no less than 19 in Reading, 19 in Listening, 21 in Speaking and 19 in Writing
- PTE Academic 51 in all four skills

Students are strongly advised to ensure they have taken their English Language test in plenty of time.

There are also six and ten-week pre-sessional English courses available for students whose IELTS is not quite high enough. Students must have taken UKVI IELTS in order to apply for our pre-sessional courses. Further details can be found here: www.birmingham.ac.uk/international/bia

Application process

The application procedure is designed to be simple and easy for you. UCSI will provide you with the link to an online application form so that you can apply directly to Birmingham.

Applications open in fall and we encourage students to make their applications by spring, so that there is enough time for admission processing, visa applications and securing accommodation.

For your application, the documents you will need are:

- Passport information pages
- IELTS (or equivalent English language qualification)
- Academic transcripts and certified translations (if required)
- A list of uncompleted credits that you're studying/will study before enrolling at Birmingham

If you do not have all of the documentation at the time of application, please do not worry as you can provide this to us at a later date.

If your application is successful, you will be made an offer to study with us. If you are unable to submit all documents at the time of application we will make you a conditional offer.

Once the conditions of your offer are met, you will be issued with an unconditional offer, followed by a Confirmation of Acceptance for Studies (CAS), which will be required for your student visa application.

Student Route visa for study

Most students will require a visa to study in the UK. The earliest you can submit your visa application is three months before your course starts, but you can start planning straightaway. Please see our visa webpages:
