FAQs for the Blue Ocean Strategy Masters of Business Administration

. What is course duration?

Minimum: 18 months. Maximum: 36 months. Students are required to complete 40 credit hours.

. How many semesters in a year/intakes?

Three semesters. 3 intakes in a year. (Intakes: Jan, May & Sept)

. How many subjects?

A total of 13 subjects are to be taken (including 3 elective subjects) for a total of 40 credit hours.

. What are the entry requirements?

Minimum Entry Qualification would be A bachelor degree or equivalent in any discipline, with 5 years managerial working experience.

Language Requirements would be

Band 6.0 in IELTS; a score of 213 (computer-based) or 550 (paper-based) in TOEFL; or a first degree from a university where the medium of instruction is English.

. Is there any specialization?

The **BOS MBA** allows all the students to specialize in Blue Ocean Strategy.

. Do I need to complete a thesis?

No. But there is final project – Blue Ocean Case Study.

. How long does it take to be certified as a BOO Practitioner?

Certification can be obtained within the duration of the MBA course if students fulfill the additional requirements of the certification process, which are: the BOS case study and online examination by Blue Ocean Strategy Initiative Centre.

. How frequently do the students come for classes?

Weekly learning time of 3 hours per week per module - which can consist of lectures, projects, discussions, seminars and case presentations, live consulting forum, etc.

. Are the classes on weekdays or weekends?

Depending on modules, classes will be held in evenings on weekdays, or weekends to cater for working adults.

10. What is the time of classes?

Evenings from 7-10pm. Weekends: 9am-12pm, 2-5pm

11. Where is the venue?

- i. UCSI University Campus and,
- ii. Downtown venue subject to prior arrangements.

12. Who are the teaching faculty?

The teaching faculty consists of full-time and part-time lecturers of UCSI University with close collaboration and support from BOS practitioners from UCSI Blue Ocean Strategy Regional Centre (UCSI-BOSRC) as well as our adjunct practice professors.
