The Speakers



Professor Dr Ong Eng Tek

Professor Ong holds a PhD in Science Education from Cambridge University, UK, an MEd in Curriculum and Instruction from the University of Houston, USA, and a B.Sc. with Ed. (Hons) in Mathematics and Chemistry from USM. He had also followed through a two-year postdoctoral fellowship program at Cambridge University, UK. He was a recipient of the Commonwealth Scholarship for his PhD and a recipient of the Malaysian Government Scholarships for his MEd and Postdoctoral. Additionally, he was a recipient of the NZODA (New Zealand Overseas Development Agency) and the CIDA (Canadian International Development Agency) fellowships for his professional attachment at Auckland College of Education and the University of British Columbia respectively. Currently, he is a Professor at the Department of Education, Faculty of Social Sciences and Liberal Arts, UCSI University. His experiences include teaching in two national secondary schools; having seconded at SEAMEO RECSAM as a science education specialist and subsequently, a senior science education specialist as well as the Head of Science Division; working as the Senior Assistant Director at the Inspectorate of Schools in the Malaysian Ministry of Education; and lecturing as a Professor in Science Education at Sultan Idris Education University.

Associate Professor Wong Bee Eng

Dr Wong Bee Eng is an Associate Professor at the Faculty of Social Sciences and Liberal Arts, UCSI University. Prior to this appointment, she was Associate Professor at the Faculty of Modern Languages and Communication, UPM. From 2016-2019, she was a consultant at the ELU, Gamuda Bhd, where she designed tests for talent acquisition and profiling employees' language abilities. She also wrote modules and conducted coaching and training sessions at the ELU from 2017-2022. Dr Wong has published a number of journal articles, book chapters and books, mainly in the areas of second language acquisition, discourse studies, and assessment and evaluation. Her main research interests are in the areas of second language acquisition and learning, language testing, assessment and evaluation at the workplace, and discourse studies.



Associate Professor Dr Tan Wee Hoe

Dr Tan Wee Hoe graduated from Multimedia University, Malaysia in 2003 with a Bachelor of Multimedia (Honors) in Film and Animation. He worked as a 3D animator in a Canadian computer-animated science fiction comedy television series, titled Tripping the Rift. Then he was appointed as a specialist at the Malaysian Institute of Information Technology, Kuala Lumpur University (UniKL), where he taught courses in the Diploma in Animation program until he received a Master of Multimedia (e-Learning Technologies) from Multimedia University in 2007. In 2008, Wee Hoe received a scholarship from the Malaysia Government to pursue a PhD in Education with University of Warwick, UK. Upon returning to Malaysia with a PhD, he continued his career path in the academia with Sultan Idris Education University (UPSI). From 2013 to 2017, Wee Hoe was the Deputy Director (Creativity and Innovation) and then the Director of the UPSI Education Research Lab. After that, he was awarded the Hubert H. Humphrey Fellowship to visit the College of Education in Penn State University (PSU), and in 2018, he was appointed as a visiting research scientist at the Yale Center for Health and Learning Games. In 2022, Wee Hoe retired from UPSI and joined UCSI University under the Faculty of Social Sciences and Liberal Arts. He is currently conducting research into educational game design, development and validation. Apart from being an associate professor in the Education Department, he is also the Head of Research and Postgraduate Studies.



Assistant Professor Dr Lin Siew Eng

Dr Lin Siew Eng is currently an Assistant Professor in the Department of Education, Faculty of Social Sciences & Liberal Arts, UCSI University. She completed her Master of Arts (Education) and Doctor of Philosophy in English Language Education in Universiti Sains Malaysia. Her areas of specialisation are Teaching of English as a Second Language and Reading Assessment. Her areas of research are Benchmarking English Language Reading Abilities, Reading Matrix Development and Benchmarking English Language Grammar Proficiency.
