There is no doubt that pharmacists in the country and worldwide have proven to be extremely valuable in their contribution in easing the enormous strain brought upon by this COVID-19 pandemic. Pharmacists from the community, hospital, industry, and research practice have been mobilised in various ways to prevent the spread of the virus, support the additional burdens placed upon medication management systems, supporting and to advise the public on health matters all while carrying out their regular duties at work.

One of the biggest contributions by pharmacists to the pandemic specifically has been to ensure a robust and efficient cold chain supply in the distribution and handling of the vaccines. Stories of pharmacists together with other health care professionals trekking and travelling through rough terrains to bring COVID-19 vaccines to the rural and Orang Asli settlements have emerged on national news, bringing to light how crucial pharm-

cists are as frontliners in vaccine management throughout the community.

The massive advances made during the creation of the many vaccines on the market could also not have been made possible without the contribution of formulation scientists and pharmacists in the field of research. The development of new vaccines especially the mRNA vaccines against COVID-19 has been one of the most important contributions of pharmaceutical sciences. Furthermore, new formulations, treatments and even existing pharmacotherapy are constantly being researched and evaluated for their immunological and anti-viral properties by scientists including formulation scientists and pharmacists. One of the biggest hurdles in the COVID-19 vaccine management system has been the deployment of vaccines in areas that lack adequate refrigeration and freezers. This significant limitation has triggered the search for vaccine formulations that are temperature-stable completely eliminate the need of cold-chain.

This pandemic has brought about a spark of innovation by pharmacists and formulation scientists to tackle this public health problem swiftly. Our graduates who are now practicing pharmacy in various healthcare sectors nationally and globally as well as our future graduates of pharmacists and formulation scientists can greatly contribute to the frontiers of pharmaceutical science by bringing about change and innovation to the community and the world. #FuturistPharmacist #BPharmUCSI


KNOW YOUR MEDICINE TALK SERIES @ FPS




